Tall Letters - Letters that fill the entire writing space from bottom line to top line.

Short Letters

Letters that extend from the bottom line to the midline. The letters **r**, **s**, **v**, and **w** extend slightly above the midline.

Intermediate Letters

The letters **d** and **t** fill three-quarters of the writing space.

Tail Letters Letters that fill the space below the bottom line. The letters J, Y, Z, f, g, j, p, q, y, and z have lower-loops (tails) that fill the space below the bottom line.



Line Quality The smoothness, evenness, color, and thickness of the pencil line.
